

I encourage you to deeply analyze each question you missed. If multiple-choice tests are tricky for you, you will want to put some good hard work into improving your test-taking skills. This will help your grade in this class (50% from tests) and your chances of getting college credit upon taking the AP Exam in May.

For the first test of the year, you will earn $\frac{1}{2}$ point for each missed question you analyze, as long as your “test correction” is thorough and thoughtful. To get the credit, you must complete ***all*** of the tasks below. The points will be added to your original test grade.

FOR EACH MISSED QUESTION:

- a) Explain ***why*** the correct answer is correct.
- b) Explain ***why*** the answer that you chose (or, if necessary, any of the other options) is incorrect.
- c) Categorize the TYPE of error you made on this question
Examples:
 - Forgot the term
 - Mixed up the meaning of a term with another
 - Misread the question
 - Misunderstood the concept
 - Did not study this concept enough (or at all)
 - Other? Explain...

REFLECTION: after you have completed the corrections, answer the following:

Do you see patterns in the errors you made? (Were you consistently misreading the question? Forgetting terms? Etc.) Whatever the issue, what can you do to better your performance in the future?

Note: You are ***ALWAYS*** welcome and encouraged to do corrections throughout the year. You will not, however, be *given* points for these corrections. Rather, learning will be your ***INTRINSIC REWARD***. 😊
